Leaning | Beginning to connect with the topic

What is something that you have hoped or prayed God might bring about in your life, that to this point, he still has not done?



Learning | Getting clear on What was taught

How is the Old Testament related to the plan God chooses to reveal in the New Testament? Is it continuation or an about-face? Explain. The wait had been 400 years since God's people had the final message in Malachi 4:5–6. Luke "opens" his book with 1:17 and connects the 400 year gap "seamlessly." Read Malachi 4:5–6 and Luke 1:17.

What was the most helpful or inspirational part of the sermon for you?

Zechariah doubted God's message through the angel. Why do you think people doubt God? How might the following verses encourage someone in doubt— Psalm 37:4, 1 John 5:14–15, 2 Peter 3:9?



Living | Starting to live like Jesus daily

Doubt can be like a "weed" in your "faith garden." What is the "fruit" of doubt left untended?

Consider Galatians 5:22–23 which highlights the fruit of the Spirit. Which of these fruit is growing in you now?
